Why should my library switch to the new URL as soon as possible?

Access to Scholastic's TrueFLIX, the new e-resource provided by the Office of Commonwealth Libraries, will only be available to libraries that update to the new URL. Additionally, popular EBSCO e-resources Web News and Newswires are now available directly from the list of e-resources for those that switch to the new URL. Finally, remote access statistics (for public libraries) for some e-resources will only be available by using the new URL.

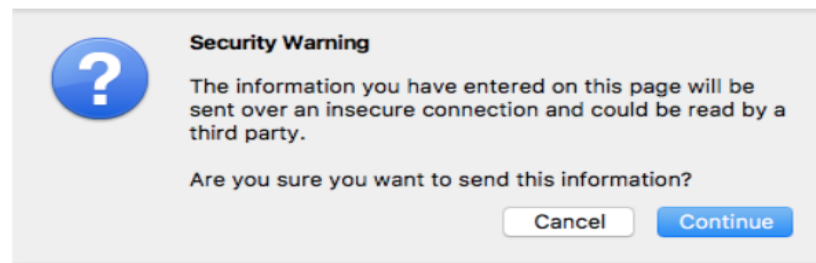
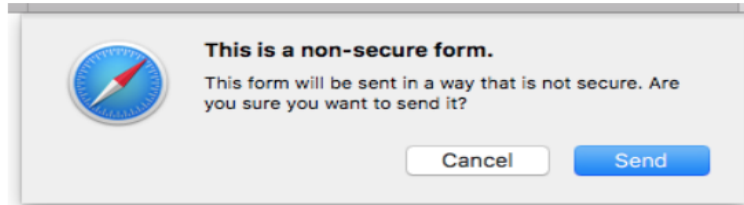
1. **Don't panic! - the deadline is now October 31st and we can help you!**

GETTING AROUND

Home and Browse

The TrueFlix Home screen offers two browse options: a category browse and a thumbnail browse.

The category browse utilizes the two groups of TrueFlix titles on the left and right of the screen: People, Places, and History to the left and Science and Nature to the right. Below these titles are nine and twelve tabs, respectively, which correspond to each of these two groups' categories. For People, Places, and History, the categories are American Indians, Ancient Civilizations, Biographies, The Civil War, Continents, The Thirteen Colonies, U.S. Government, U.S. Regions, and Westward Expansion. For Science and Nature, the categories are Animal Kingdom, Disasters, Earth Science, Ecosystems, Experiments, Extreme Nature, Extreme Science, Health, Human Body, Outer Space, Physical Science, and The Solar System. Clicking on one of the 21 categories accesses a category browse screen from which you can choose among thumbnails for all the TrueFlix units in that category. Clicking on any of these thumbnails brings you directly to the title screen for that unit.

The thumbnail browse utilizes the eight large featured TrueFlix thumbnails that rotate at the center of the Home screen and the carousel of thumbnails that rotates at the bottom center of the screen. Clicking on any of these thumbnails brings you directly to the title screen for that TrueFlix unit.

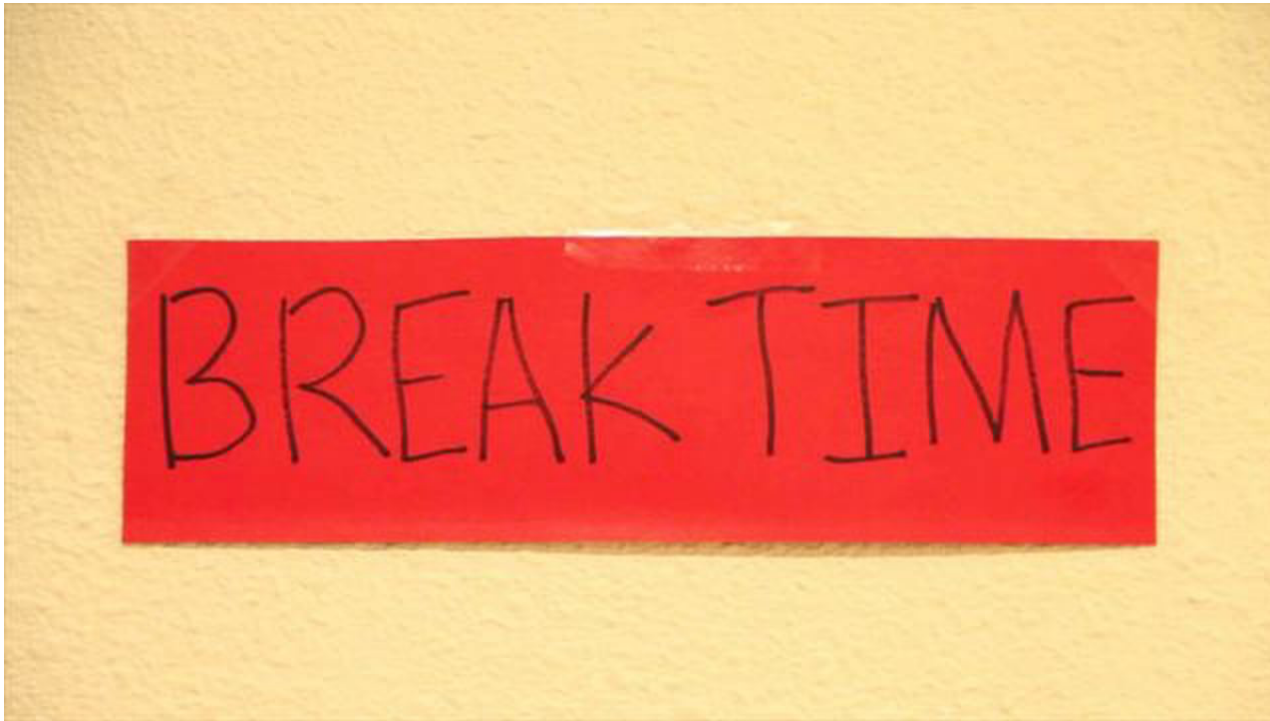
